Background: eBook task force Task Force findings: All levels of staff are asked for help with eBooks Need for more training/support materials Communication must be improved

Complete required data for annual mandatory surveys: IPEDS ARL

ACRL Demonstrate library resources are being used

Print circulation: Binary - it circulated or it didn't Stats don't reflect how a book is used or even if it's used, just if it's checked out

Eresources usage statistics: Vendors provide searches, record view, results clicks, full downloads, chapter/section downloads, html access, pdf access

Projectcounter code of practice: standards to ensure vendors and publishers provide library customers with consistent, credible comparable usage

About COUNTER reports: Provide standard for how online usa

Provide standard for how online usage stats are recorded and reported Provides quantitative data for how much resources are used Illiuminate the relative values of resources Play a role in renewal process

Looking ahead:

Need to look beyond simple measure of ebook use Predictive acquisitions relying on information on which materials are used or unused may offer an alternative approach to collection development
