





SUPPORTING PATRON WELL-BEING

I NEED YOUR HELP

what's a database?

I need an article that makes the exact argument I intend to present in my speech

What's the textbook for my class?

Historical newspapers... genealogy ... statistics

...choosing a topic

P: I NEED YOUR HELP

L: Okay, I am not sure how I can help. Do you need writing assistance or research?

P: What would you do if you were me?

L: Honestly, can not do this online. You sound like you need to speak with someone in person, and I highly recommend that you contact the counseling folks tomorrow AND talk with your professor.

L: Are you searching on a topic, or do you have four titles that you're looking for?

P: i have four specific titles that my professor wants us to read

L: I recommend using the Library One Search, and then clicking on the "Advanced Search" link.

P: i was sent that ten mins ago

P: nothing pulled up

P: ive done all of those things

L: Okay, then give me one of the articles and I'll see what I can find.

[Librarian provides search instructions]

P: And that's under advanced search for journals?

L: Yes. Start here: <http://xxx.serialssolutions.com/> and click on "Advanced Search."


P: ok i found the first one

SUPPORTING SELF-EFFICACY

Model of the Information Search Process



(Kuhlthau, 2004, p. 82)

P: Hi!

Hi! What is a good topic for health?

Hi! Which database should I use for nonverbal communication?

(Uncertainty? Optimism?)

Hi! where do I get the articles on importing rare wood?

Hello. What books do you have on the history of Mackinac Island fudge!?

(optimism – warranted and otherwise)

I've been researching for days ... my teacher say I din use the right kind of artical

... where are your peer reviews? I can't find anything on my topic

(confusion, frustration, doubt)

Hi! I need a book from interlibrary loan
Hello. how do I track down this citation?
(sense of direction, confidence)

this is cool! Awesome!

.... Thats exaclly what I was lookin for
(satisfaction)

I can't believe there's no research on
Mackinac Island fudge!
(disappointment)

EFFECTIVE VIRTUAL LIBRARIANSHIP IN PRACTICE

P: Hi, I have a question! What is a journal? Is it appropriate for academic research paper?

L: Hello! I'm Pat, a librarian at X. I can help you when your librarians are not available.

P: Hello!!! I'm Mei

L: Hi Mei! Is this your first time writing an academic research paper?

P: Yes!

L: Ok. [Librarian explanation of journal]

P: Oh I see!!! Can I find the journal through database search?

L: Yes, you can find journal articles through a database search. Do you know where to find the databases available at your library?

P: I know where is it.. but many kinds of database is there.... I am confused

L: It can be confusing. Some of these databases are subject-specific...

...

L: Do you have enough information to get started on your own, Mei?

P: Yes Sure!!!!!! Really thank you for your help!

L: You're welcome! Good luck with your paper!

P: I can't find this book by applebuam.

L: did you check the catalog?

P:[logs out.]

P: I can't find this book by applebuam.

L: I'd be glad to help – do you mean applebaum?

P: yes

L: let's try the catalog search – the spelling really matters here – let's use the 'advanced search.... [gives directions]

P: GOT IT!

VR Communication Problems

Conversational analysis found communication problems, including:

- Use of ambiguous terminology.
- Difficulty of providing and following instructions when the librarian and patron are not in the same physical space.
- Differences in expertise between librarians and library users.

(Koshik & Okazawa, 2012)

Virtual Reference Addressing Well-being and Self-efficacy

Building on Kuhlthau's paradigm by adding awareness of:

- Emotional aspects of communication
- Social aspects of communication (saving face, turn-taking, negotiating roles)
- Cultural aspects of communication (politeness, respect, humor, idiom and speech levels)
